Funding for First Aid Training

The work of a vital local charity has been supported with a generous donation that will train staff with crucial life-saving skills. The Where Next Association runs activities for those with severe learning disabilities, where health risks are high.

The Where Next Association was delighted to receive a donation of £1845 from the George Bairstow Charitable Trust, to provide the latest First Aid training to 27 staff and volunteers. Helping those with severe learning disabilities find self-esteem and confidence, the Association provides training, workshops and work experience for clients.

Jo Wood, Business Support Manager at Where Next said "Our clients all have learning disabilities and most have health complications. As such, we encounter a wide range of illnesses and injuries every year.

"We are delighted that the George Bairstow Charitable Trust have funded next year's first aid training. This will ensure that we can put greater focus on helping and supporting our clients.

The George Bairstow Charitable Trust, set up in memory of George Bairstow, aims to continue his significant charitable work prior to his untimely death in a road accident in November 2013.
